**Updates & Reminders**

**Cover Crop Seed Testing -** As farmers are getting ready for fall cover crop seedings it’s a good time to remind that if bin run seed is used it should be tested. USDA and state cost-share programs follow NRCS practice standards and testing bin run seed is a requirement of these standards. Bin run seed can be submitted to ODA for testing or another lab capable of seed testing can be used. Attached is an informational flyer on ODA’s cover crop seed testing.

**New Cyber Security Requirements** – Ohio HB 96, requires political subdivisions to establish and implement a cybersecurity program aligned with industry best practices. The program must ensure data availability, confidentiality, and integrity, including annual employee training, risk assessment, threat detection, and a cyber incident response plan. **Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Website Compliance** - In April 2024, the U.S. Department of Justice published a rule that sets technical requirements for state and local governments to follow making sure their websites, social media accounts, and mobile apps are accessible to people with disabilities. Working with OSU Extension a virtual training has been scheduled for November 6<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am to provide an overview of the rule and what it means regarding website management. **Drought Impacts**- While much of the state did receive some rain over the last week, dry weather is still in the forecast. As drought conditions persist across the state at some level, you can contribute real time conditions and data through a national database. Citizen science contributions for current drought conditions in your area are very helpful and can be made by utilizing the [Condition Monitoring Observer Reports \(CMOR\) System](#). This can be a helpful tool to help capture the real-time conditions that are occurring locally in your area. The drought impacts fact sheet attached will walk you through the steps for submitting a local conditions report for your area.

### **Ohio Watershed Leaders (OWLs) Conference – in Review**

The Ohio Watershed Leaders (OWLs) conference was held Sept. 4-5<sup>th</sup> in Athens Ohio. Attendees toured local conservation sites on Thursday, followed by a day of presentations on Friday. Topics included the Racoon Creek restoration and Scenic River designation, acid mine drainage, nutrient management and grazing, central Ohio water study, TMDLs, forestry pollution mitigation, and more. It was a great conference, and attendance was at full capacity! Next year's conference will likely be held in northeast Ohio – we hope to see you there!

**Conservation Ditch Program**- Now accepting applications for 2025 in all 88 counties. The deadline for applications is **June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026**. This year's rules are identical to 2024 with one major exception: applications will be reviewed individually on a first-come-first-serve basis until the deadline or until funding runs out (whichever comes first). So, don't wait too long to apply if you have a good project! **Sustainability & Indigo Ag:** With ODA's portion of the H2Ohio Budget being cut approximately 11% cut, ODA has started conversations with private companies to explore public-private partnerships to further H2Ohio. Many private companies are funding carbon, sustainability, and soil health initiatives with best management practices similar to H2Ohio's. ODA will continue to look for partnerships in this arena to expand the opportunity for Ohio Agriculture and work towards developing additional opportunities to H2Ohio participants. Current ODA is piloting an outreach effort with Indigo Ag focusing on cover crops in the Maumee Watershed. This is not an exclusive partnership and ODA will be searching out additional partnerships over the next year. **ODA will NOT** be sharing any H2Ohio data or receiving funds from any entities in this effort. ODA's efforts are focused on creating additional payments from the private sector that go directly to program participants.

**Maumee Enrollment:** 14 Counties in the Maumee Watershed opened up for enrollment on Sept. 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Eligible counties include: Allen, Auglaize, Defiance, Fulton, Hancock, Hardin, Henry, Lucas, Mercer, Paulding, Putnam, Van Wert, Williams, and Wood. Field Enrollment is exceeding expectations acres are coming in very quickly for this enrollment.

**WLEB Enrollment:** WLEB Enrollment wrapped up on Sept. 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Eligible Counties were Crawford, Erie, Huron, Marion, Richland, Sandusky, Seneca, Shelby, Wyandot). Current Field enrollment is over 796,000 Acres within the 10-County project area. This is a 35% increase in acreage and field enrollment within these 10 Counties. SWCD staff will shift their focus to developing Nutrient Management Plans and contracts for H2Ohio, which will need to be completed later this winter.

**Farmland Preservation** – Counties, SWCDs, land trusts, cities and townships are invited to apply to the Office of Farmland Preservation for Local Sponsor Certification. The Deadline for Local Sponsor Certification is October 1, 2025. Any organization interested in being a local sponsor for the 2025 landowner application year must apply. The application and can be found at <https://agri.ohio.gov/wps/portal/gov/oda/programs/farmland-preservation-office/local-sponsors/> Local sponsors who complete the above-mentioned Local Sponsor Certification application and qualify will be allocated a portion of the Local Agricultural Easement Purchase Program (LAEPP) 2026 funds. These funds are used to purchase agricultural easements on Ohio farms.
